Queering Sápmi: life stories from a minority in a minority. The four year long Queering Sápmi project gathered stories from queer Sami, the indigenous people living in the north of Sweden, Norway, Finland and the Kola Peninsula in Russia. The queer perspective have not been present in Sami organizations, and the Sami perspective have also been missing in the LGBTQI movement in Sweden. The project resultaed in an internationel photo exhibition, a book translated to 6 languages, a theatre production, and in queer samis connecting and organizing the first ever Sápmi Pride.
